The California Angus Association and the California Junior Angus Association invite you to participate in the 2016 State Field Day being held at the Stanislaus County Fairgrounds in Turlock, California, May 28th and 29th. The following is information that should help to produce another wonderful show. Your cooperation is appreciated.

Bedding: Bedding will not be provided. Bedding will not be available for purchase at the fairgrounds. Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning out stalls before leaving fairgrounds.

Classes: All classes will follow the American Angus Association rules. After steers are weighed classes will be broken into three divisions – Angus Steers, Black X Steers, and All Other Color Steers.

Special Note: ****NO Commercial Heifer division available this year****

Show Categories: Bred and Owned Bulls, Bred and Owned Heifers, Owned Heifers, Cow/Calf (heifers may be exhibited in either Owned or Bred and Owned, not both). Champions will be selected in each category. Entries will be listed in order of age (youngest to oldest) and will be shown in the same order. All animals must be registered in the sole name of the exhibitor. Exhibitors must have the original registration certificate on each animal for inspection at the show. Any animal, upon check-in, which does not have a legible tattoo corresponding to its registration certificate is ineligible to show. Exhibitors must show their own animals, unless they have more than one animal in the same class. Juniors competing in this event must be at least 9 years of age and not yet 21 years of age as of January 1, 2016.

Due to popular request we are formatting our show classifications similar to the Western Regional Junior Angus Show, which is held in Reno, NV each year in April.

- Classes will be made up after cattle have been checked in and may not follow standard classifications in age breakdown.
- Show classifications:
 - Heifers: January 1, 2014 through December 31, 2015
 - Bulls: January 1, 2014 through December 31, 2015
 - Cow/Calf:
 - Cows three (3) years of age or younger, cows must be born on January 1, 2013 through August 31, 2014. Calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf and be no more than 280 days of age on the day of the show.
 - Cows four (4) years of age and older, cows must be born December 31, 2012 or earlier. Calf must be the cow's most recent natural calf and be no more than 280 days of age on the day of the show.
 - *Important Note: Calf must be registered and tattooed by show date and have original registration paper.*

All breeding animals must be registered and tattooed prior to entering the grounds. This includes calves as well!

Entries must be postmarked by May 16th: Entry fees are \$20 for breeding animals and \$35 for steers. There will be a late fee of \$15.00 per entry if not postmarked on or before May 15th. Original registration papers must be checked in prior to 10:00am on Saturday, May 28, 2016. No duplicate or photocopied registration papers will be accepted.

Did you buy your heifer at Angus Days? Is your heifer or bull from a cow you purchased at an Angus Days sale? Don't forget to register for the CAD Jackpot show. A separate form is needed - Please complete the California Angus Days Jackpot Show entry form. There is no fee to enter!

SHOWMANSHIP REQUIREMENTS

- Member of the American Angus Association with a member code.
- Member of the California Junior Angus Association.
- Must be at least nine (9) years old but not yet twenty-one (21) years old as of January 1, 2016.
- Member must own Angus cattle.

- Member must have actively shown or participated as an Angus breeder/exhibitor in the past twelve months.

The California Angus Association has approved the above requirements as guidelines in selecting two young people as representatives of California for the National Show in Grand Island, NE held July 3-9, 2016. The funding and financial support provided by the California Angus Association is greatly appreciated.

National Jr Angus Assoc. Awards Available

Bronze and Silver Awards -- The National Junior Recognition Program provides an opportunity for young Angus breeders to become nationally recognized for continued achievement. This program is based on activities over a Junior member's entire career. There are three levels of recognition; Bronze, Silver, and Gold. Bronze and Silver Awards can be earned at any age. The Gold Award, however, will be given only during the last year of eligibility as a junior member. Winners of the various levels receive a specially designed pin, cast in the metal of the respective award (Bronze, Silver, or Gold). Recipients of the National Junior Recognition Program Awards also receive local, regional, and national recognition through media and at Angus functions.
